# Opportunity's Knocking

- This is an opportunity for students to be able to not only work in what you went all these years to school for but to be ahead of the game when you graduate.
- Field experience, work experience, meeting people in the field, and best of all, you get paid for it!!

# To qualify for the internship program :

- Must be at least 16 yrs. Old
- Must be a US Citizen
- Minimum GPA of 2.0 and be enrolled in at least half time status
- Must be able to complete 640 hrs. of career related work before graduating from a 4-year program
- Must be enrolled in and pursuing a field of study that relates to the career fields offered by Forest Service

# Internship Pay & Applications

- Pay rate is dependent on level of education and work experience.
- Application periods vary on internships
- Applications can be submitted to [www.usajobs.gov](http://www.usajobs.gov)

# Watershed Management Experiential Learning for USDA Careers Internship Program

- Paid \$4,500 Internship
- Undergraduates : \$12.50 per hour for 360 total hours.
- Graduates : \$15.00 per hour for 300 total hours.
- Up to \$560 for purchase of approved mileage reimbursement, supplies, and materials
